*Spines are books you can read to get a good overview and/or use throughout the year by reading sections to cover the key events of the time period. *After getting a good overview of the specific event and time, you can read historic fictions, biographies and stories that surround that event or time period. This is a great way to help children see and feel history. Timelines are a great way to tie all the historical events so you can see how it fits together.*

Books by Subject

The following books are listed by age and category as a resource for families. Some of the books can be found in the public library others have to be ordered or borrowed. You can usually find them used through Amazon at a really low price, but many families in our co-op already have these books on our shelves so you can send out an email for the book you need and there will most probably be someone in the group who has it and will let you borrow it. Please note that while the books are listed by age, they are general categories. Older children often enjoy reading the books in the younger categories and most of the books listed (especially in the middle age group) are great for read-a-louds. Family books are read-a-loud books on the topic and/or are books that cover the subject and can be read together as a family to get overall understanding of the specific topic and/or time period. Age levels are general reading levels with *younger* children being 5-8, *middle* 9-12, and *older* 12 and up. The older category would generally be considered scholar level. The Younger level contains a lot of picture books which can be read and enjoyed by children under age 6 as well as the entire family. Who doesn't love a great picture book?
